Philippians, Chapter 4, Verses 6 and 7 say...

/PHI 4:6

Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.

/PHI 4:7

And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

In the first fifteen verses of Romans, Chapter 1, Paul does a great job of outlining very important biblical truths in just a few words...I've selected out some of them...

Even Paul mentioning His own name in Romans Chapter 1 is significant, because what he was tasked with by God, in light of who he is, edifies us. He is the worst person who ever lived, yet he was given one of God's most important jobs. And we smile, knowing we are not as bad as he is, so we conclude that God must love us more. God doesn't love us more, of course, but it's a comforting thought, if only for a moment.

If we want to, we can ignore the depth of these words and press on to the end of Romans. For those of you with a suspense complex who can't wait to see what's next in Romans...for those of you with a completion complex who think the pace of study is too slow...for you I suggest you read on in Romans...it takes only an hour to read the sixteen chapters of Romans... with its eleven teaching chapters and its five exhortation chapters...but that is hardly the point. It takes a lifetime to grasp Romans. And I think our God is happy that we stop along the way to smell the roses. We have been parked at Romans, Chapter 1, Verse 8 to smell the rose called prayer.

The few hours of this study has changed me...I certainly hope it has changed you...the study has changed my thoughts about prayer...I think prayer is one of the most underestimated privileges that we Christians have...and maybe other believers don't underestimate it, but I certainly did...and I'm absolutely certain why...because prayer is dependence. Prayer is our fervent appeal to the Supreme Judge of the Universe to decide every case that we bring before Him in our favor. The problem is that **He** decides...we put our

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burdens in His hands. There are no more capable hands, yet somehow we think that if we don't do everything in the Christian Life, then nothing will get done. Great thought, until the problem requires the supernatural, which many of our problems do require. When it is apparent there is nothing we can do with our problems, which is often the case, prayer is the answer. A congregation member, in talking about prayer said, "My first thought when I have a problem is not prayer...my first thought is, 'What do I have to do to fix this?'" So it is with all of us. Counting on self first and God second is certainly one way to do things...yet God considers our problems to be His responsibility, so why wouldn't we put our problems in more capable hands?

For those of us who have studied legalism for years, we've heard it said, "Prayer is not a problem solving device." When the movie is made on that comment, it will be entitled, "One of the Greatest Lies Ever Told." Prayer is absolutely a problem-solving device of the best kind...prayer allows us to slam our problems on God's back. Again...God considers our problems to be His responsibility, so why wouldn't we put our problems in more capable hands?

Welcome back! What is prayer?

/PRAYER

A privilege given to us by God which gives us direct and immediate access to Him...an intentional and intimate heart-to-heart talk with God, on whom we are totally dependent, in which we ask Him to use divine omnipotence to help us in time of need, especially when no human solution is possible or apparent...a public or private display of our faith that our God always hears us, intercedes for us, and blesses us with solutions to our most pressing concerns.\

Here are some things I learned about prayer...

When we pray, it is an acknowledgement that there is a God...and that we, as believers, have a relationship with Him. Seldom do we expect help from those with whom we have no relationship. John, Chapter 17, Verse 3...

/JOH 17:3

"This is eternal life (the Zoe Life), that they may know You, the only true God (and Father), and (the Lord) Jesus Christ whom You have sent."

When we pray, we are asking to receive...so it focuses us immediately on the giver. John, Chapter 1, Verse 12 says...

/JOH 1:12

But as many as received Him (the Lord Jesus Christ through faith alone in Him alone), to them He (the Lord Jesus Christ) gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name...

When we pray, there are any number of things we might request...

<PRAYER CHART>

To be saved...to be stabilized...to be directed...to be protected...to get relief...to be taught...to be rescued...to be unified...to be assisted...these are just a few tings we can ask for...and our God is willing to do them all for us.

When we pray, we have a right to expect answers, because God promises us believers that He will answer us...Luke, Chapter 18, beginning at Verse 1...

/LUK 18:1 Now He (the Lord Jesus Christ) was telling them (His disciples) a parable to show that at all times they ought to pray and not to lose heart...\

/LUK 18:2

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...saying, "In a certain city there was a judge who did not fear (respect) God and did not respect man."

/LUK 18:3

"There was a widow in that city, and she kept coming to him (the judge), saying, 'Give me legal protection from my opponent."

/LUK 18:4

"For a while he was unwilling; but afterward he said to himself, 'Even though I do not fear (respect) God nor respect man...'"

/LUK 18:5

`…yet because this widow bothers me, I will give her legal protection, otherwise by continually coming she will wear me out. '"

/LUK 18:6 And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge said..."

/LUK 18:7 "...now, will not God bring about justice for His elect who cry to Him day and night, and will He delay long over them?"

God answers us right soon!

To be a Christian who is of use to the Lord, an intentional prayer life is a requirement...First Thessalonians, Chapter 5, Verse 17 says...

/1TH 5:17 ...pray without ceasing...\

We are commanded to make prayer a habit. And the prayerful ones of God do...Colossians, Chapter 4, Verse 12...

/COL 4:12 Epaphras, who is one of your number, a bondslave of Jesus Christ, sends you his greetings, always laboring earnestly for you in his prayers, that you may stand perfect and fully assured in all the will of God.\

Paul spent quite a bit of his time praying...Acts, Chapter 9, Verse 11...

/ACT 9:11

And the Lord said to him (Ananias), "Get up and go to the street called Straight, and inquire at the house of Judas for a man from Tarsus named Saul, for he is praying....

Romans, Chapter 1, Verses 9 and 10...

/ROM 1:9-10 For God, whom I (Paul) serve in my spirit in the preaching of the gospel of His Son, is my witness as to how unceasingly I make mention of you,// always in my prayers making request, if perhaps now at last by the will of God I may succeed in coming to you.\

When we pray, it brings out in us an attitude of gratitude...First Thessalonians, Chapter 5, Verse 18 says...

/1TH 5:18 ...in everything give thanks; for this is God's will for (those of) you in (union with) Christ Jesus.

Prayer comes from the heart...and when we pray, we can always count on a God with ears wide open, with arms wide open, ready to receive our requests, so He bless...Matthew, Chapter 11, Verse 28...

/MAT 11:28 "Come to Me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest."

John, Chapter 6, Verse 37...

/JOH 6:37 *"All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will certainly not cast out."*

John, Chapter 7, Verse 37...

/JOH 7:37 Jesus stood and cried out, saying, "If anyone is thirsty, let him come to Me and drink. "\

Matthew, Chapter 21, Verse 22...

/MAT 21:22 "And all things you ask in prayer, BELIEVING, you will receive."

Make it YOUR habit to pray.
